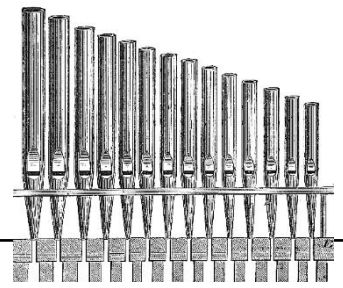

Summer of 2020 will be different, but I hope you are able to find enjoyment in the increasingly tiresome phrase "new normal." — *Bill Robinson*



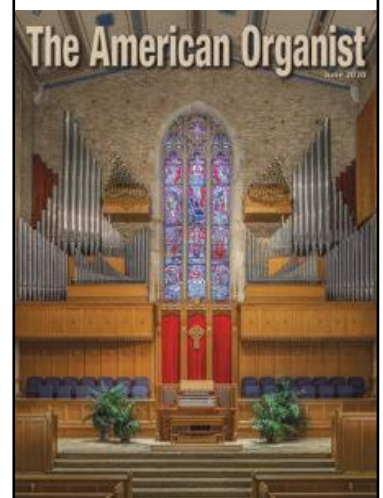

### Music Director (part-time, 20 hours/week)
